

3. Trauma Emergencies

- A. Upon arrival, insures scene is safe, appropriate agencies are on scene. Gives clear report to additional units of scene. Gives prompt report to incoming medic unit.
- B. Determines within 30 seconds if patient is sick or not sick, and starts appropriate care rapidly. Confirms Mechanism of Injury or Trauma.
- C. Ensure spinal & cervical stabilization is started in a timely fashion within the correct assumption with MOI.
- D. Gives correct oxygen delivery with appropriate deliver equipment at the correct liters per minute, for the delivery device chosen.
- E. Assigns personnel to do vital signs and scribe.

Pass	Fail

Extrication:

- A. Upon arrival, if first in, gives appropriate size-up of situation. Including vehicle level of damage (minor, moderate, or major with intrusion).
- B. Ensures vehicle is stable, assigns team to stabilize before getting into vehicle.
- C. Ensures, if MOI is appropriate, head stabilization is assigned immediately.
- D. If multiple patients, does appropriate triage, and assigns personnel to patients. Checks ABC's, when appropriate.
- E. Does a rapid trauma assessment. If ALS is enroute, gives appropriate report of number of patients, whether they are green, yellow or red in a timely manner. If more ALS units are needed, advises command of the needed resources.
- F. Correctly identifies the most critical patient, and determines if patient needs rapid or controlled extrication.
- G. Correctly performs extrication appropriate to the patient's condition.

Critical criteria: Identifies situation as critical or not. Identifies needed resources and asks for them. Does appropriate trauma assessment, taking Mechanism of Injury into consideration. Ensure head stabilization is in place quickly, and assigns personnel to appropriate task. Example; Vehicle or other danger stabilization is in place. Ensures there is the circle of safety and apparatus is appropriately placed on scene to create a safe working zone.

4. Transport (Only needed for transporting agencies)

- A. Takes a set of vitals during transport.
- B. Ensures patient signs the Billing Authorization Form, and patient is given the Patient Privacy statement.
- C. Gives a report with all of the required information to the hospital while enroute with an estimated ETA.
- D. Upon arrival at the hospital, gives report to the receiving nurse, gives her/him a copy of the scribe sheet, and obtains her/his name.
- E. Completes, correctly, the Medical Incident Report, documenting the mileage, nurses name, bed number, that the patient signed the Billing Authorization Form, and that the patient was given a patient privacy form.
- F. Ensures that the ambulance is restocked, clean and back in service.
- G. Contacts Prospect by phone or radio that the unit is back in service and gives the appropriate type code.

Pass	Fail

Passing Criteria: Takes a complete set of vitals during transport. Communicates to patient what the Billing Authorization Form is and what it is for, explains the patient privacy form. Give a concise and correct report to the nurse. Correctly completes an MIR with the appropriate transport documentation. Ensures the aid unit is back in service and restocked. Assist with decontamination, correctly re-making the gurney, and cleaning the back of the ambulance, using the appropriate cleaning products.
